Program Admissions Requirements

There are no program admission requirements for the B.A. or B.S in Community and Public Health with a concentration in Community Health.

Accelerated BA/BS to MHE Program

Students accepted into an accelerated undergraduate program may take departmentally approved graduate coursework as part of their undergraduate curriculum. These credits will count towards both their bachelor's and master's degrees and can fulfill major requirements, upper-division requirements, and/or free electives. Community and Public Health, Community Health Concentration Accelerated Criteria

This accelerated program gives outstanding bachelor's degree students in Community and Public Health, Community Health Concentration a "fast-track" option to pursue graduate-level coursework towards the Master in Health Education degree during the last two semesters of undergraduate coursework and count up to 12 credits of that coursework towards completion of the bachelor's degree.
